

Guides to Research at the Hirsch Library

Amida by Koei (Japanese, Muromachi Period, 1472) Accession Number: 92.193 Carved Wood with traces of polychrome, 21 x 17 ¾ x 16 1/8 inches (53.3 x 45.1 x 41 cm)

This hollow, carved wood sculpture of Amida Nyorai (Buddha) with a piece of glass or crystal inlaid in the forehead was created by the Japanese sculptor Koei in 1472. It is the only known work by this artist, who was an adherent of Pure Land Buddhism.

Before researching a work of art from the MFAH collection, it is helpful to view the work first hand. The information in books journals will be far more meaningful if you have taken advantage of the opportunity to inspect the object itself.

Suggested sources for better understanding this particular piece are given below. "Reference" books are found on the library's main floor, and "Ready Reference" books are behind the information desk. Other books can be obtained by asking at the information desk.

This reference guide is just the tip of the iceberg on helpful resources in the library's holdings. Many of the suggested resources above have their own **bibliographies**. Each of these may lead you to another resource that would also be helpful in your research here in the museum or in another library. To find additional books, use keywords such as "Buddhism" and "Japan" in the **on-line catalog**. Keep in mind that some keywords might be transcribed in Japanese; you should try both in your search. For example, while "Jodo" and "Pure Land Buddhism" are synonyms, a search using both terms may yield different results. Once you find a few relevant titles, pay close attention to subject headings to find similar books.

Examples of useful subject headings are:

Buddhism
Art, Asian –Exhibitions
Art, Buddhist
Amita□bha (Buddhist deity) –Art
Gods, Buddhist, in art
